Chord Rustlers Bring Home District Competition Honors

Bozeman Chord Rustlers Barbershop Chorus placed 7th among 18 choruses in the Evergreen District competition in Spokane, Washington on October 1st. The Chord Rustlers were also named the "Most Improved Chorus" in the entire District. Performing "Jeannie with the Light Brown Hair" and "My Honey's Lovin' Arms," the chorus reached a score higher than any in their 30-year history. The Barbershop Harmony Society hosts three levels of competition to determine the best choruses and quartets in the world; this competition brought together the best choruses and quartets from Montana, Idaho, Washington, Oregon, Alaska, British Columbia, and Alberta. Under the direction of Natalie Berdahl, the Chord Rustlers were joined on stage with dual members from the Helena and Missoula chapters. Upcoming performances of the Chord Rustlers will be their free Veteran's Day show on November 11th at the Bozeman Senior Center and their annual show March 3, 2012 at the Belgrade High School Events Center featuring the 2006 International Quartet Champions, "Vocal Spectrum." The Chord Rustlers welcome men of all ages to their join them in the Fireside Room at Grace Bible Church on Tuesdays at 7:00 pm for an evening of fun and singing. DH

Jingle Bells



James Lord Pierpont (1822–1893) wrote *Jingle Bells*, originally titled *One Horse Open Sleigh* in 1857. Even though it is commonly thought of as a Christmas song, it was written and sung for Thanksgiving. A plaque commemorating the "birthplace" of *Jingle Bells* adorns the side of a building in Medford, Massachusetts. Pierpont wrote the song there, at the former Simpson Tavern. *From Bridge Town Sound "Sound Bytes"*

The Barbershop Lead *Creed*

- 1. We will not flaunt in front of others the fact that we have the best voice in the group (unless the music calls for it, which, come to think of it, it usually does).
- 2. We will do our best to stay in tune, but won't worry too much about that since the other guys have to follow us anyway.
- 3. As consummate gentlemen, we will continue to let the Basses feel like they're the most important part of the group, even though without the melody they would have nothing to harmonize to.
- 4. As we focus on shaping and caressing the song, if we forget a word (or all of them), we won't worry too much since the other guys have to follow us anyway.
- 5. We will never allow a baritone to sing louder than us, even when we're on the seventh. The melody must be heard!
- 6. We will be sensitive to the Tenor's need to feel special. We won't overdo it, though.
- 7. In a chorus, although we will do our best to follow the Director, we realize that we have to take advantage of all the opportunities in a song to show off our wonderful Lead voices. After all, that's what the audience has come to hear, right?
- 8. We will do our best to cover the fact that the Baritone has a weak emaciated instrument, otherwise he's be singing Lead.
- 9. When in doubt, pitch it up!
- 10. When a Coach/Director advises us that we were under pitch, or too loud, we will always nod appreciatively, all the while knowing that we were just doing what the Composer/Arranger originally intended.

Three of the **Storm Front** quartet's fathers were in a really good comedy quartet called **Chordial Celebration**. They were based in Scottsbluff, Nebraska, which is in the Rocky Mountain District. This was about as good a show quartet as one will ever hear. The music was quite good, but the comedy was outstanding. It seemed to come out naturally, as if it hadn't been planned. At one point in their act the bari (I think) blew the pitch and then went on to play *Sugar Blues* on the pipe. Gary Drown, the lead, moved to Kearney, Nebraska in the Central States District, pretty far from Scottsbluff, but they kept going. Gary's son Darin, a music major in college, is now the bari in **Storm Front** as well as director of one of the Denver choruses. If you have seen a **Storm Front** video, you know that besides near-perfect music they have a good comedy act. They learned a lot from their fathers. One of the less-pleasant parts of growing old is losing friends at an increasing rate. Gary died of cancer within the past year. He was a good musician and a good friend. Who is this Chord Rustler?


Periodically, "The Old Chorale" will have an article describing a member's life and experiences.
