WAS PARKINSON RIGHT?

I was interested the other day in seeing a list of employees of the Society at the national office. In addition there was a brief statement in a recent *Harmonizer* about the current membership in the Society. In the latter case the membership, which I remember at one time being 38,000, is now about 23,000. This caused me to wonder whether the staff has been reduced in proportion. I think I know the answer, but am too lazy to investigate further. If you work in any organization long enough you realize that Parkinson's Law is fairly accurate. The law originally stated that "work expands to fill the time available for its completion." One corollary to that is that the work becomes too much for one person, so he or she has to have an assistant. In colleges and universities, for instance, deans have to have associate deans, who in turn have to have assistants. Back to the Barbershop Harmony Society— with fewer staff doing less work, would the organization fall apart? Just wondering. *Dewey*

Harmony Rendezvous—2012

Once again the kids that come to our Rendezvous camp amazed me with what they could accomplish in four days. Out of the 66 that came to camp (including the younger music staff) 13 were first-time attendees and most of those were new to barbershop. But you would never know it from the performance they gave on Sunday afternoon. Those of our Chord Rustler family who attended the Sunday concert were treated to a special afternoon, and those who were not able to be there missed a very well-done show. The boy's director, Jim Debusman, told me each of the first three days how special this event was to him and asking me to convey that to the kids. Natalie Berdahl, the girl's director, worked to put together a great sound and choreography package. The girls rose to the occasion.

We had a talent show dress rehearsal on Saturday evening during which we had 15 small groups put together a number for that show. They selected a song they liked and worked on it through the week and then sang it for the talent show. From that group, seven were selected by the directors to perform their number on the Sunday concert. Many of these groups included some of our first-time campers. Like a lot of new quartets, many selected a song that was too hard for the time they had to work on it and then to do a reasonable performance. This is one thing Jim and I discussed to help with next year's camp, so more of the kids get the opportunity to perform in smaller ensembles on the Sunday show. The Reynolds Recital Hall is a fabulous place to perform; but there were losts of unfilled seats. We need to do a better job promoting the concert to include more than just the families of the Rendezvous kids who come to hear this performance.

Thanks to all the Chord Rustlers who helped me with the many aspects of this year's camp. Camp 2013 has been set for June 19–23 at Luccock Park. I have already started working on items to help provide another successful camp in 2013. *Dennis Bloxham*
